## **ABOUT TOM RYAN**

*Ohio State University Head Coach, 2009 National Coach of the Year, 2X Rev Coach of the Year, 7X Conference Wrestling Coach of the Year, NCAA Finalist, 2X All-American.*

In just three seasons of work, Tom Ryan has led Ohio State wrestling to back-to-back second-place finishes at the NCAA

Championships, an accomplishment that earned him the 2009 National Coach of the Year honor. Last season, Ryan and his coaching staff produced four All-Americans for the second-consecutive season, In addition to NCAA coach of the year, Ryan received his second-consecutive Rev Coach of the Year honor in 2009, becoming the only two-time recipient.

As the head coach at Hofstra University from 1995-2006, Tom was a seven time conference coach of the year, two time New York State Coach of the Year, led his team to six consecutive conference titles. At Hofstra, Tom guided 71 wrestlers to NCAA championship appearances and 15 have earned All-American honors and 45 have won conference titles.

During his wrestling career, Ryan was a two-time NCAA Division I All-American for Iowa (second in 1991, third in 1992) as a member of the Hawkeyes' 1991 and 1992 national and Big Ten championships teams. He also was a two-time Big Ten champion in 1991 and 1992. Prior to enrolling at Iowa, Ryan wrestled at Syracuse, where he was the 1989 Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association Champion.
